

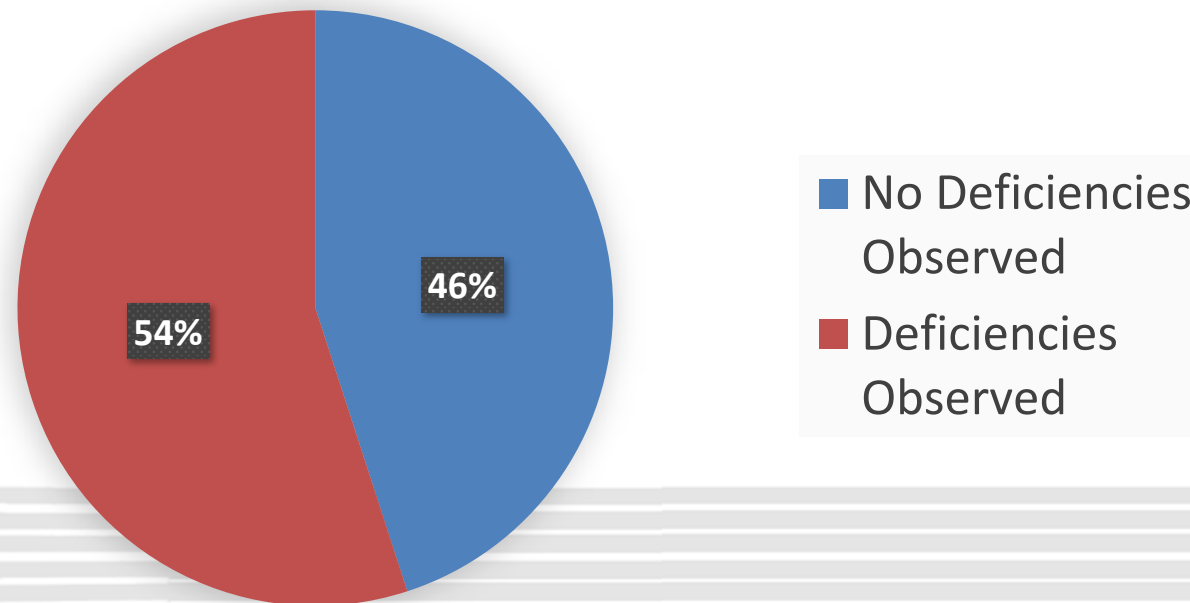

2. Overview of GDP Inspections in 2023

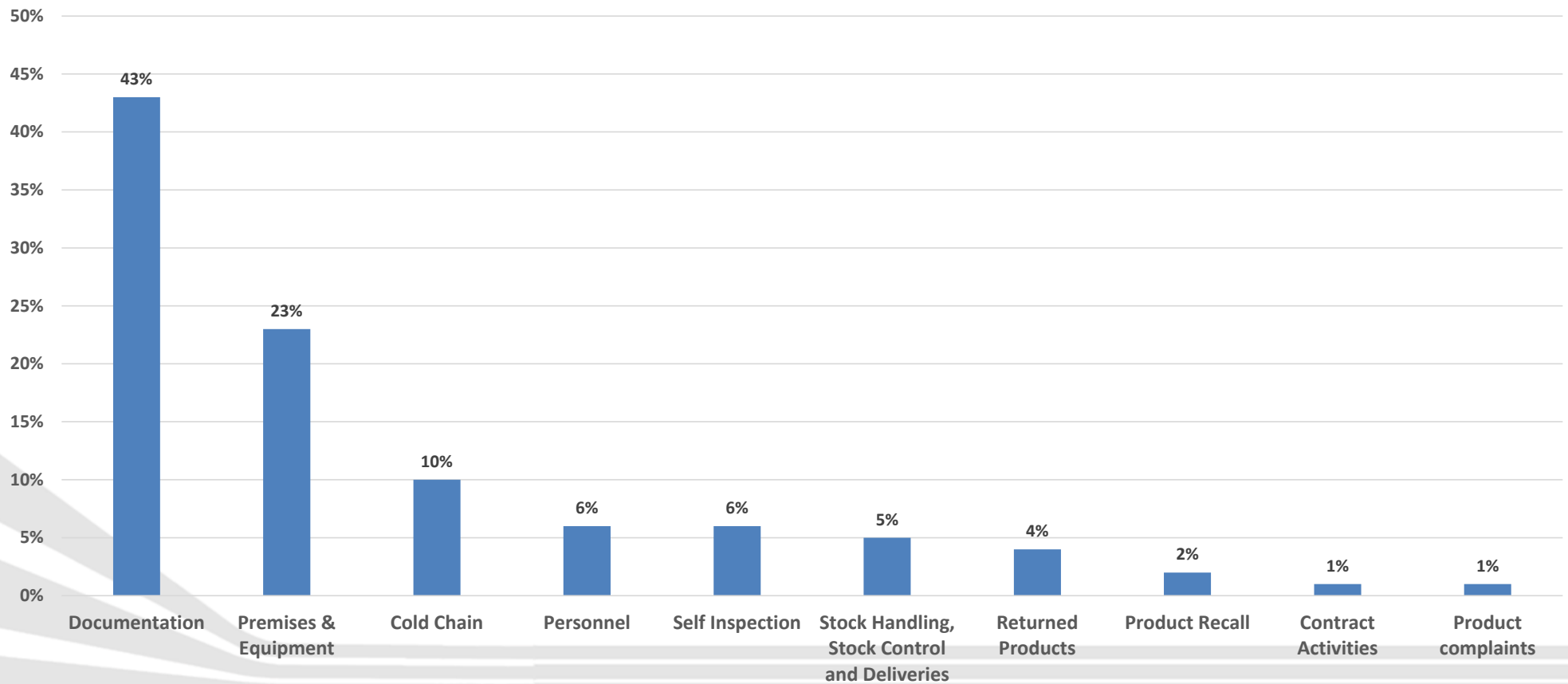
- 137 routine GDP inspections were conducted in 2023.
- 63 out of 137 inspections conducted (46 %) were found to have no deficiencies.
- 74 out of 137 inspections conducted (54 %) were found to have deficiencies.

Comparing Top 5 GDP Deficiencies Observed in 2022 & 2023

Most Common Deficiencies 2022

#	GDP Chapters	Percentage
1	Documentation	36%
2	Premises & Equipment	24%
3	Personnel	8%
4	Self Inspection	6%
5	Stock Handling, Stock Control and Deliveries	6%

Most Common Deficiencies 2023

#	GDP Chapters	Percentage
1	Documentation	43%
2	Premises & Equipment	23%
3	Cold Chain	10%
4	Personnel	6%
5	Self Inspection	6%

Documentation was ranked as the most common deficiency in 2023. Compared with 2022, Premises & Equipment, Self Inspection and Personnel remained within the 5 most common deficiencies. Cold Chain deficiencies appeared as the third most commonly cited in 2023.
